

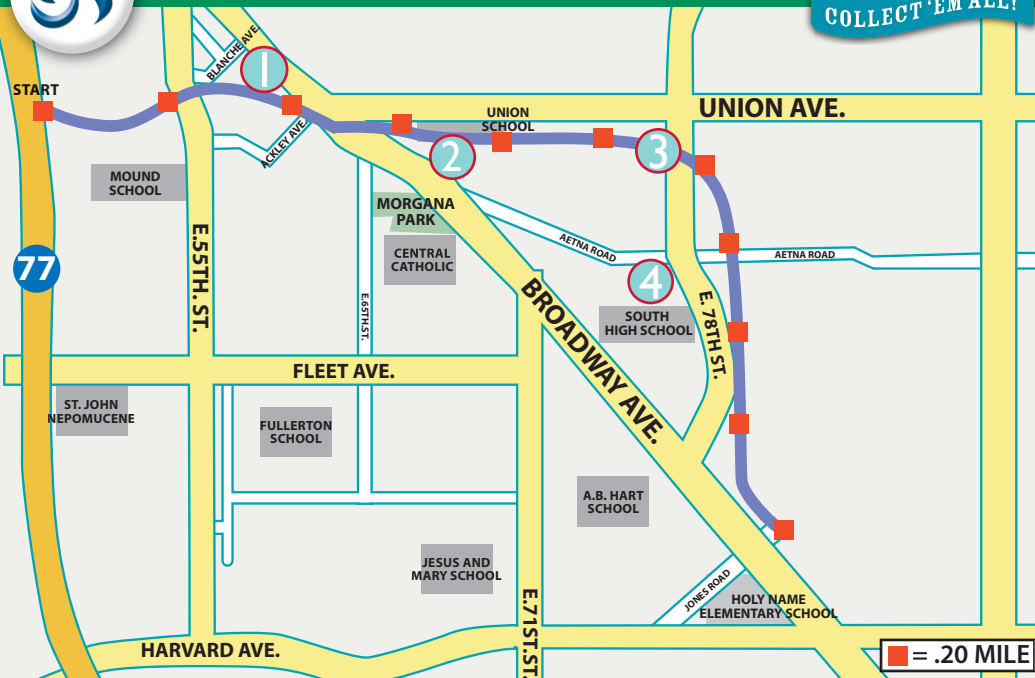

Broadway Boys and Girls Club

The Greater Cleveland Boys and Girls Club opened the Broadway facility in September 2002 to serve local youth in the Broadway community. The club, built on the upper site of the Worsted Woollen Mill which burnt July 4th 1993, serves children ages 6-18. During the school year, the club, operates Tuesday-Friday from 2:30-8:30 p.m. and Saturdays 2:00-6:00 p.m. During the summer, the club is open Monday through Friday from 10:00 a.m.- 6:00 p.m.

Metro Health Center

In response to the medical service gaps which resulted from the closure of St. Michael's Hospital, Cleveland MetroHealth opened in full-service medical clinic on the site of a former K-Mart in 2004. Services available include a dental office, radiology and lab, family practice and WIC services.

Morgana Run Trail

The two-mile Morgana Run Trail runs atop the old Wheeling and Lake Erie Rail Line originally used to haul coal to the steel mills at the west end of the neighborhood. Downsizing of the steel mills rendered this rail line obsolete. In 2003, the rail line was vacated and then, Slavic Village Development partnered with the City to replace the rail line with a multi-purpose trail.

Stella Walsh Recreation Center

Stella Walsh Recreation Center provides an array of sports and fitness activities free of charge to Clevelanders of all ages. It is one of four Cleveland Recreation Centers built through a cooperative agreement with the Cleveland Municipal School District. Long-time Center Manager Marty Piszczak has not only developed the muscles but the character of Slavic Village youth for two generations.
